EXEMPTIONS, CERTIFICATES

At the end of the semester, a student will receive the signature and be exempted from the obligation to attend classes in the following cases:

- A student who regularly plays sports in one of the departments of the Institute of Physical Education or Kandó SC in the given semester, and this is certified by the instructor.

The leading sports teachers are constantly waiting for the personal applications of those amateur and competitive sports students who would like to represent our university in the various university-college competitions organized at Budapest, regional or national level. OR

- A student who qualified for a sports association in the given semester is an active competitor and can prove this with match or competition records. Furthermore, during the semester, he will compete in at least one Budapest or national championship for the University.

OR

- A student who occasionally actively participates in house championships, university-college amateur sports competitions, other sports activities within the institution, and sports events between institutions. Based on the individual assessment of the physical educator teaching the course (More information: from the physical educators, on Facebook: <https://www.facebook.com/obudaigyetemtestneveles> or on the website: <https://uni-obuda.hu/tsi-dokumentumok/>).

Based on a medical certificate, someone is exempted from the obligation to attend class, and you will receive a signature at the end of the semester

- A student who is recommended by the specialist for a full exemption based on his/her medical certificate.

The certificates must be submitted to the instructor with whom the student took the course in the first three weeks of the study period of the given semester. The certificate/exemption submitted by the student is judged individually by the physical education teacher teaching the course.
